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Keep your project neat and tidy in a bag of your own. Hang it from your wrist to keep it close at hand. The cables add a decorative touch and the yarn we've chosen is smooth to avoid any snagging of your project yarn. You'll need more than one of these bags.

Supplies

- Yarn: Modern Cotton by Berroco, Worsted Weight (60% Pima Cotton, 40% Modal Rayon, 100g=3.5oz, 209yds=191m), 2 skeins
- Cable Needle
- 24 inch circular needle, size US 6
- DPN, size 6 US
- Row counter
- 1 stitch marker

Gauge

28 sts and 30 rows = 4 inches
in Allover Lattice Stitch

Size

Finished Measurements:
6.5 inches wide x 7 inches tall



Stitch key:

kfb = knit into the front and back of the stitch

ssk = slip 1 stitch knitwise, slip next stitch knitwise, return stitches back to left needle and knit these two stitches together through the back loops

p2tog = purl two stitches together

pfb = purl 1 into front and back of a stitch

2/2RC = slip two stitches to cable needle, hold in back, k2, then k2 from the cable needle.

2/2LC = slip two stitches to cable needle, hold in front, k2, then k2 from the cable needle.

Notes:

WS = wrong side

RS = right side

Pattern:

With yarn held double, cast on one stitch.

Row 1: kfb

Row 2: k1, kfb, knit to end of row.

Row 3-48: Repeat row 2. (row 48=49 sts)

Row 49: k1, ssk, knit to end of row

Row 50-96: Repeat row 49 until two stitches remain.

Row 97: ssk (1 st)

Cut one of the two strands, leaving a tail long enough to sew in. Begin knitting with one strand of yarn.

With the one stitch left on the needle, pick up stitches along the garter stitch edge as follows:

yo, *pick up and knit one garter edge stitch, yo*

Repeat from *to* until 194 stitches are on the needle. Place a marker for end of row.

Begin knitting in the round.

Setup for body of bag:

Row 1: knit (194 stitches)

Row 2: k95, k2tog, k95, k2tog (192 stitches)

Row 3: knit (192 stitches)

Begin Allover Lattice Stitch (from [365 Knitting Stitches](#), August 21)

Row 1: *2/2RC, k4, 2/2LC*

Row 2-4: knit

Row 5: *k2, 2/2LC, 2/2RC, k2*

Row 6-8: knit

End with a cable row (row 1 or row 5) when bag is approximately six (6) inches tall.

Knit one round. Purl one round. Knit one round.

Casing:

Begin working flat (back and forth):

Row 1 (WS): purl

Row 2 (RS): knit

Row 3: purl

Row 4: knit

Row 5 (picot edging): p2tog, *yo, p2tog* (191 sts)

Row 6: knit

Row 7: p1, pfb, purl to end of row (192 sts)

Row 8: knit

Row 9: purl
